

In the adult industry, communication is absolutely crucial in ensuring consent. It's the bridge that links individuals' comfort levels, boundaries, and desires to their actions. When communication is clear, everyone involved knows what to expect, feels comfortable voicing their boundaries, and can better enjoy the experience.

Dr. Logan Levkoff, a sexual health educator, captures this perfectly: "Consent isn't just about saying 'no' or 'yes,' it's about understanding our partners better, knowing what they want, how they want it, and when they want it. It's a conversation, a dialogue, an understanding."

And the data backs this up. According to a survey conducted by the 'Yes Means Yes' project, about 84% of participants felt more comfortable and secure when clear communication about consent was involved in their sexual experiences.

Remember, silence or lack of resistance doesn't equate to consent. As stated by the National Sexual Violence Resource Center, "Consent must be given freely, and can be withdrawn at any time."

So, let's amplify our communication skills and champion a culture of explicit and enthusiastic consent in the adult industry. Your voice has power—let's use it to make a positive impact!

Consent, at its core, is a clear, unequivocal, and enthusiastic agreement to participate in an activity. In the context of the adult industry, it's a fundamental principle that shapes every interaction and activity. But consent isn't simply a one-time checkbox; it's an ongoing conversation that takes place before, during, and after any activity.

Firstly, consent must always be explicit and informed. This means everyone involved has a complete understanding of what the activity entails and has freely agreed to participate.

Secondly, consent is an ongoing process. It's not about saying 'yes' once and moving on; it's about continuously checking in with your partners to ensure they're still comfortable and enjoying the experience. It means understanding that 'yes' to one thing doesn't automatically mean 'yes' to everything.

Thirdly, consent can be withdrawn at any time, for any reason. If at any point during the activity, someone feels uncomfortable, they have the absolute right to stop. It's essential to respect that and immediately halt the activity.

Lastly, consent is mandatory for all activities in the adult industry. It doesn't matter if it's a photo shoot, a live show, or a private performance; consent must always be present. Operating within this framework of consent not only ensures everyone's comfort and safety, but also builds trust, fosters stronger relationships, and enhances the overall experience in the industry.

Here are some ways to try for yourself!

Setting Boundaries: Before starting a live show, a model can discuss their boundaries with their viewers. They might say something like, "I'm excited for our time together today. Before we get started, I want to clarify what activities I'm comfortable with. I'm okay with X and Y, but I'm not comfortable with Z. Let's respect these boundaries and have a great time."

Handling Changing Comfort Levels: If at any point a model feels uncomfortable with the progression of a show, they can express this to their viewers. They might say, "I appreciate your enthusiasm, but I'm no longer comfortable with the current activity. Let's pivot and try something else that we can all enjoy."

Addressing User Requests: When users make requests during a show, a model can reaffirm their consent before proceeding. They might say, "User B, I see you're requesting activity C. I'm comfortable with this and happy to proceed if the rest of the viewers are okay with it."

Checking in During a Performance: During a live show, a model can consistently check in with their viewers to maintain consent. For example, they might say, "I see some of you are requesting activity A. I'm comfortable with this. If everyone's okay with it, we can proceed."

Revisiting Boundaries: If a certain activity has been agreed upon but later feels uncomfortable, the model can say, "I know we agreed to try X today, but I'm not feeling as comfortable with it as I thought I would. I'd prefer we switch gears and try Y instead."

Opening the Floor for Dialogue: At the beginning of a live show, a model could say, "Before we begin, I want to make sure we're all on the same page. I'm open to suggestions and requests, but remember, they're subject to my comfort levels. Let's keep communication open and respectful."

Responding to Non-consensual Requests: If a user suggests an activity that the model is not comfortable with, the model could say, "I appreciate your suggestion, User C, but that's outside my comfort zone. Let's focus on activities that everyone, including me, can enjoy."

End of Performance Wrap-Up: At the end of a performance, the model can recap the boundaries set, saying, "I hope you all enjoyed our time together today. I appreciate everyone's respect for the boundaries we set. Remember, maintaining this respectful atmosphere makes these performances enjoyable for everyone, including me."

"Hello everyone, thank you for joining me today!"

Before delving into the show, they take a moment to establish boundaries: "Before we start, I want to go over a few things. I'm absolutely thrilled to have you here and I'm open to requests, but I won't engage in anything that makes me uncomfortable. I'll always let you know if a request crosses that line. So, let's respect each other's boundaries and have a wonderful time together!"

This approach sets a positive tone and establishes clear expectations.


The viewers understand what's acceptable and appreciate Model A's openness, enhancing their connection and making for a more enjoyable and respectful live show.




Model B is also about to start a live show. They're eager to please their audience, so they jump right into the show without discussing any boundaries or what they're comfortable with. In their enthusiasm to entertain, they overlook the crucial step of setting expectations around consent.

During the show, a user requests an activity that makes Model B uncomfortable. With the spotlight on them and without clear boundaries set at the beginning, Model B feels pressured to oblige the request, compromising their boundaries and their comfort. In doing so, Model B sets a precedent that their boundaries can be pushed without respect for their consent. The discomfort might affect the quality of the show, and could lead to feelings of regret and unease, impacting Model B's future performances and mental wellbeing. It also sends a wrong message to viewers that ignoring boundaries is acceptable behavior.






